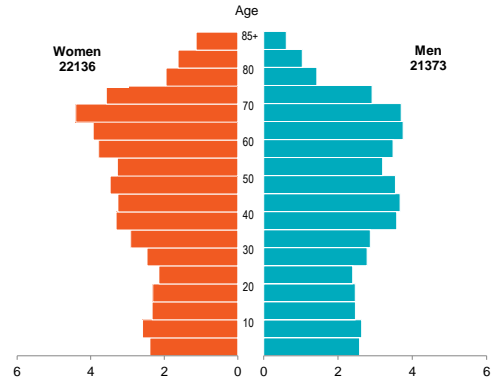

Population by five-year age groups and sex, 2022 (%)



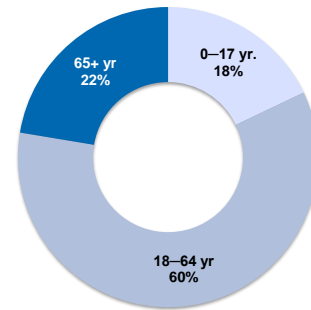

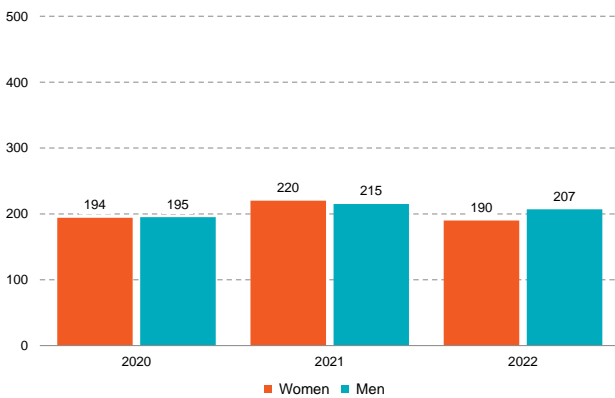

Population by age, 2022



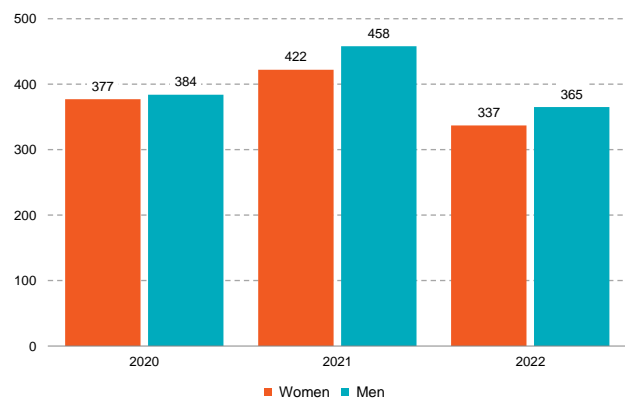

## Live births by sex, 2020–2022



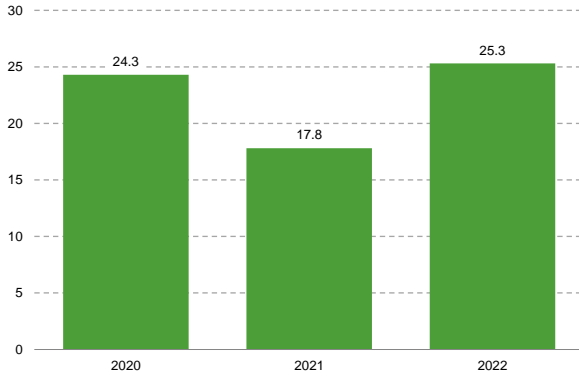

## Deaths by sex, 2020–2022



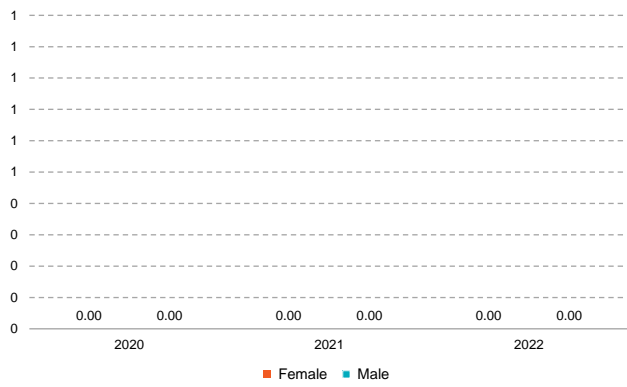

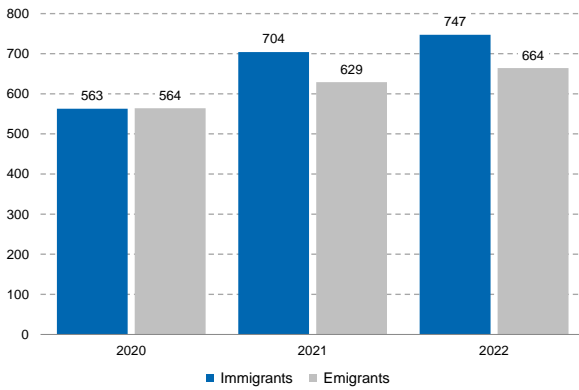

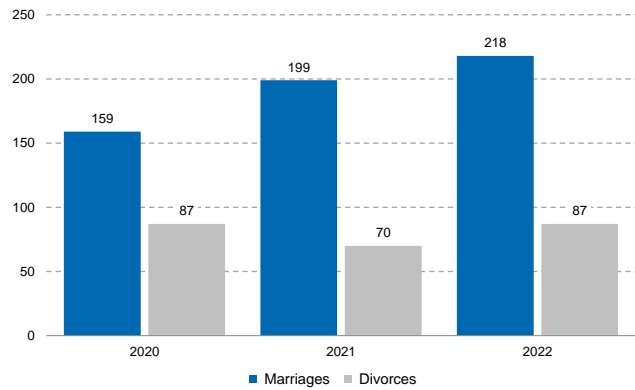

**Immigrants and emigrants, 2020–2022**



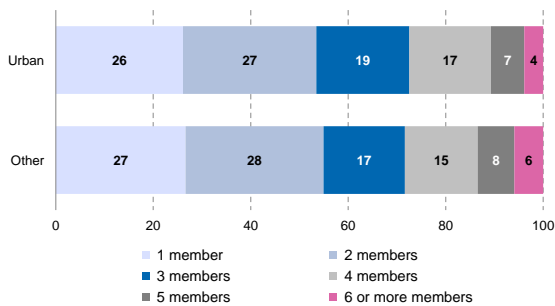

**Marriages and divorces, 2020–2022**



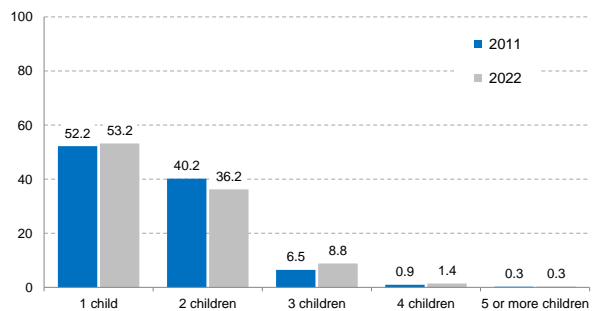

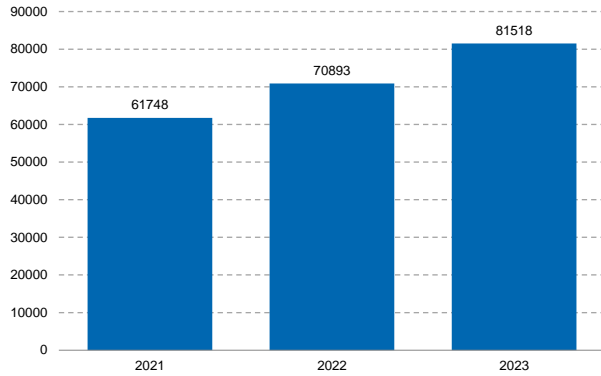

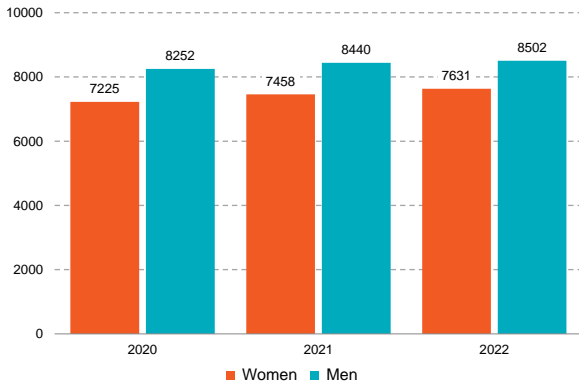
## Average annual net salaries and wages\*, 2021–2023 (RSD)

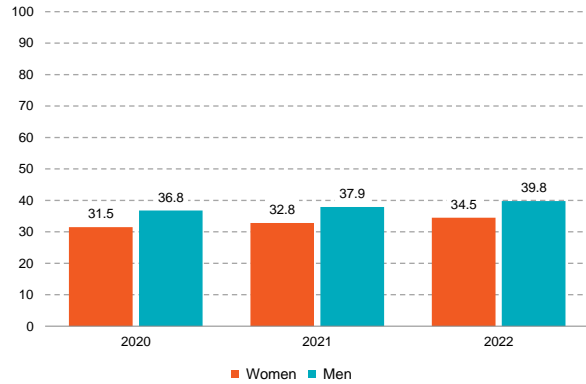

## Registered employees by municipalities of residence, 2020–2022\*



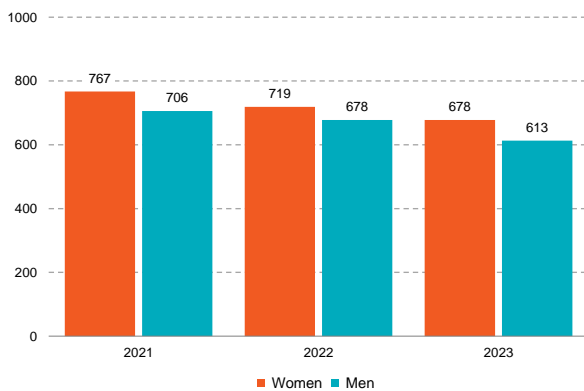

## Registered employees by municipalities of residence comparing to population number, 2020–2022 (%)



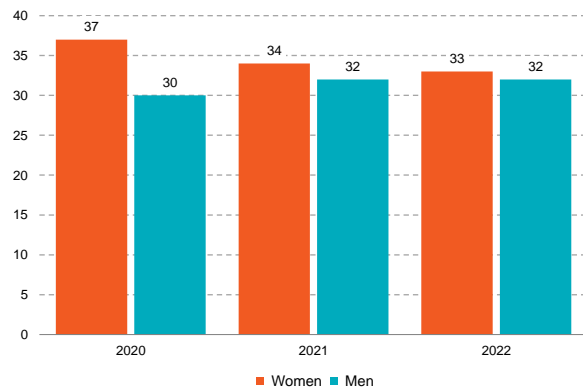

## Registered unemployed by sex, 2021–2023\*



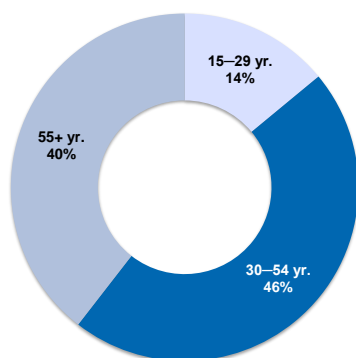

## Registered unemployed per 1,000 inhabitants, by sex 2020–2022\*



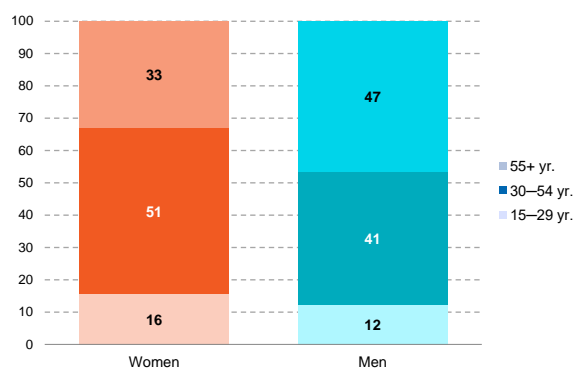

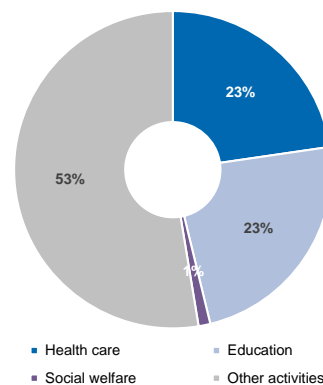

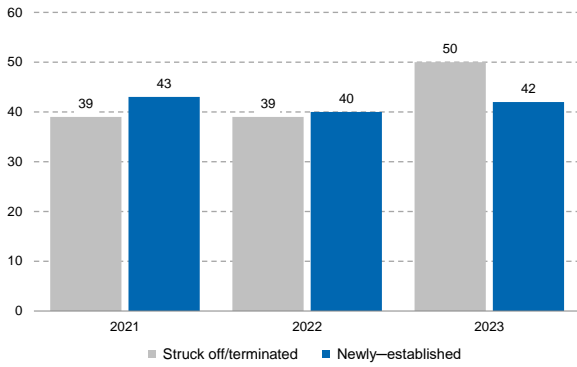

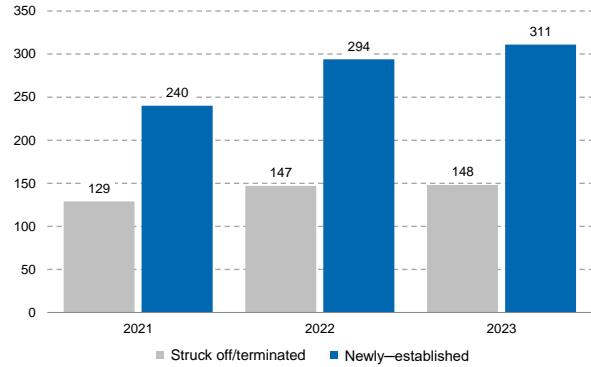

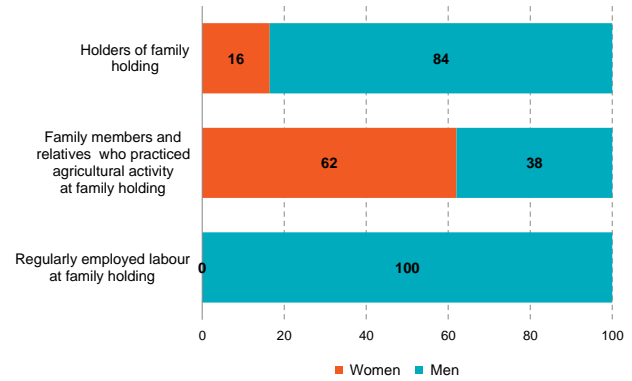

## Members and labour regularly employed at family holding by sex, 2012 (%)



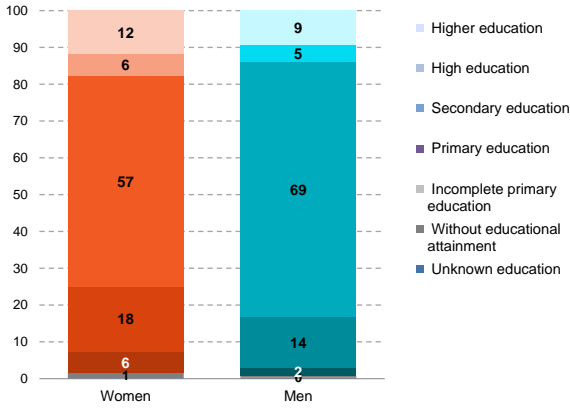

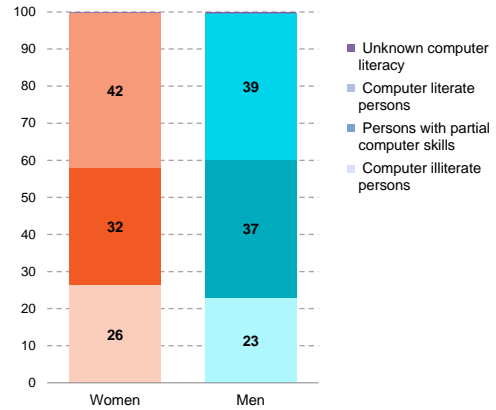

**Population aged 15 and over by educational attainment and sex, 2022 (%)**



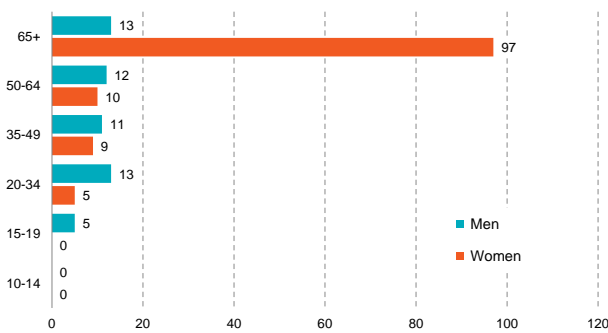

**Population aged 15 and over by computer literacy, 2022 (%)**



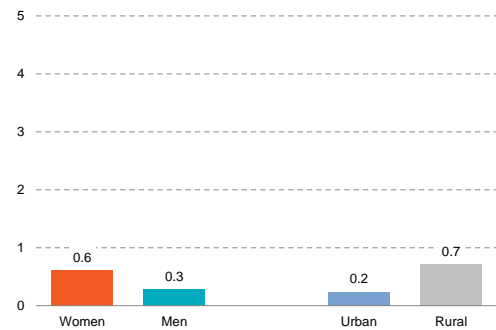

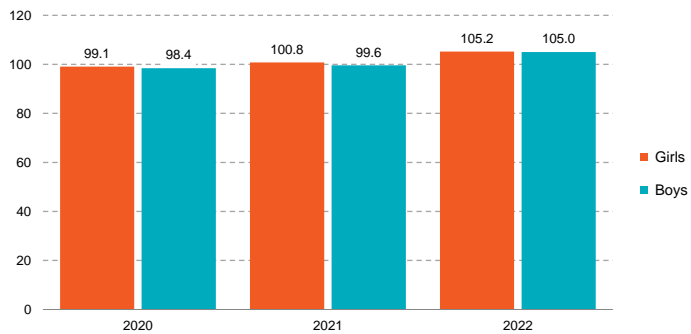

**Coverage of children by the preparatory preschool programme, 2020–2022 (%)**



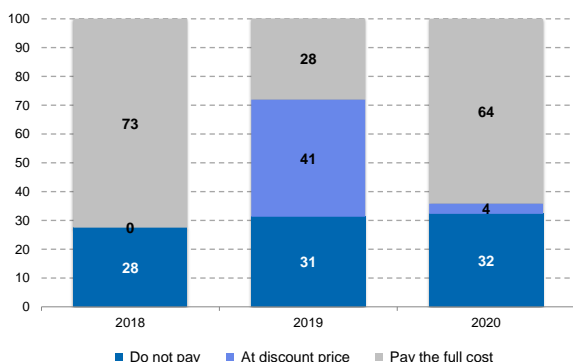

**Children attending preschool education by the share of costs payable by their parents, 2018–2020 (%)**



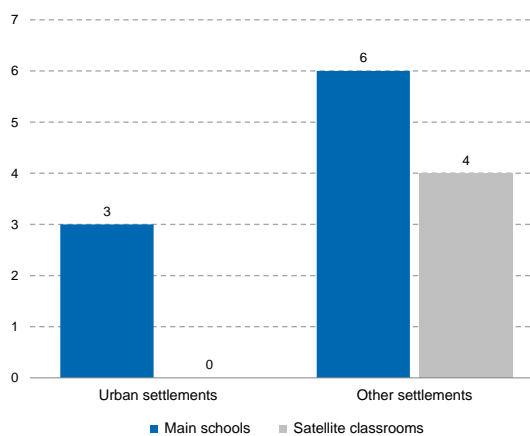

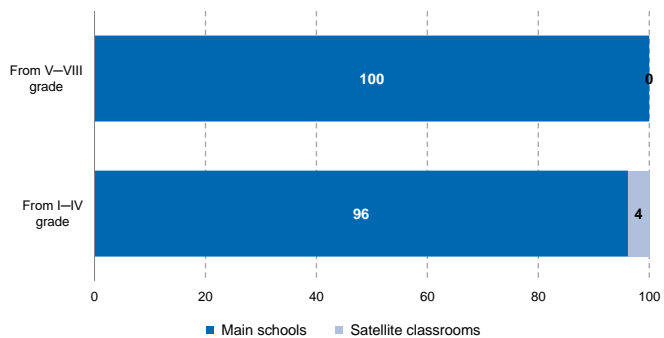

### Students enrolled in primary school, 2022 (%)



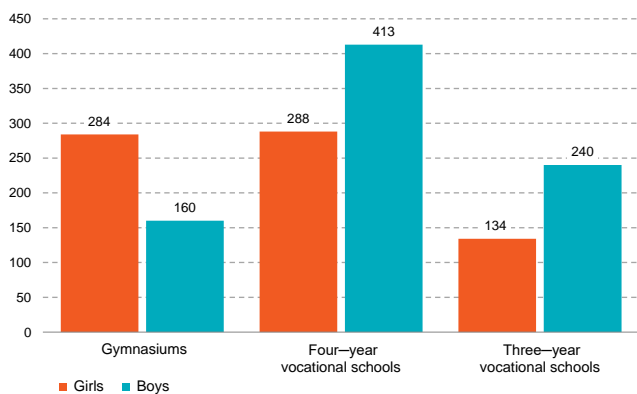

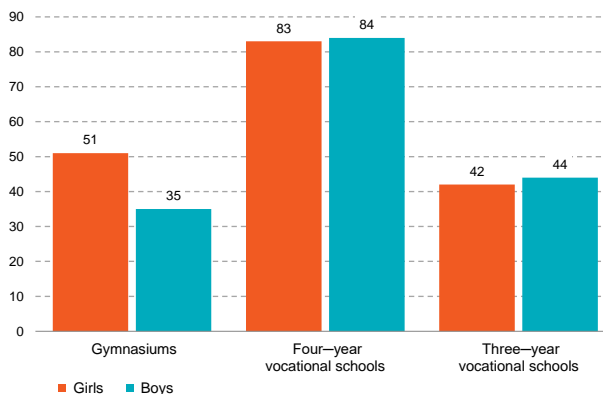

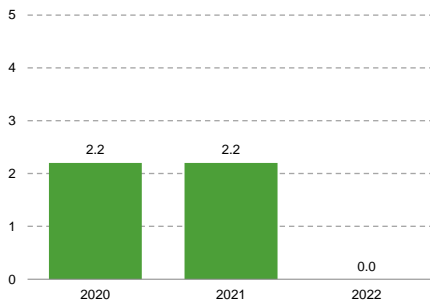

**Incidence of tuberculosis, 2020–2022**

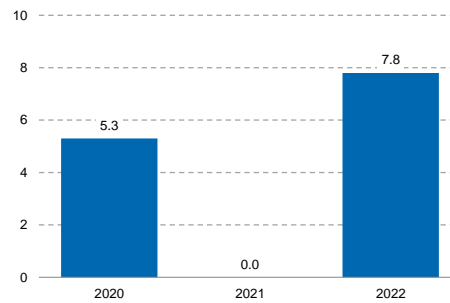

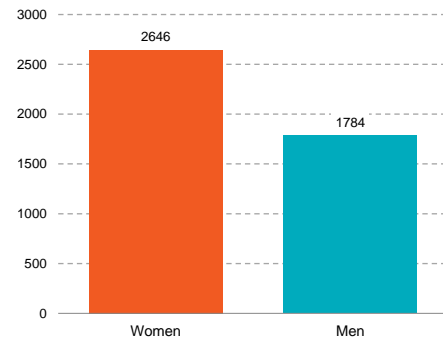

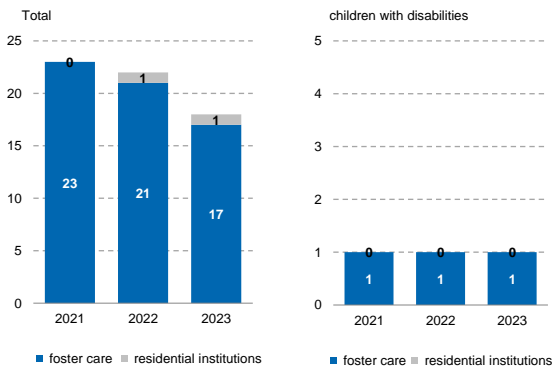

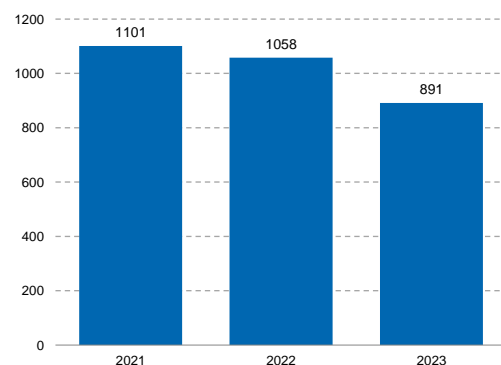

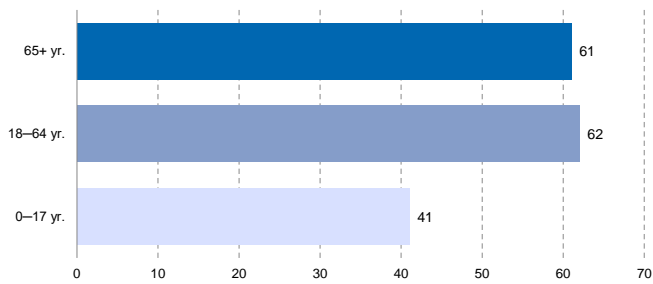
**Number of cash social assistance (income support) beneficiaries (persons), 2021–2023\***

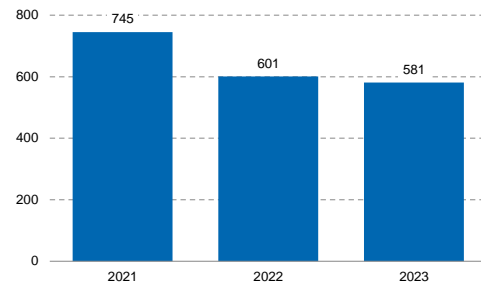

**Number of child allowance beneficiaries, 2021-2023\***



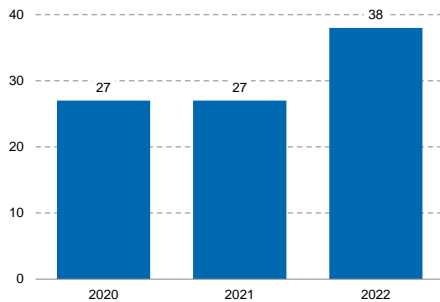

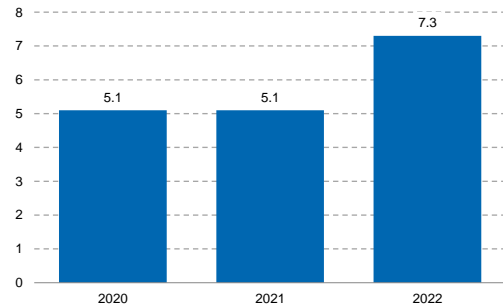

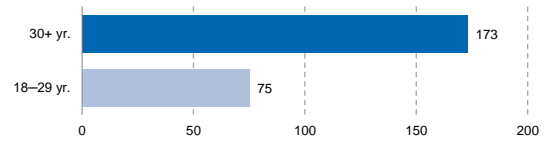

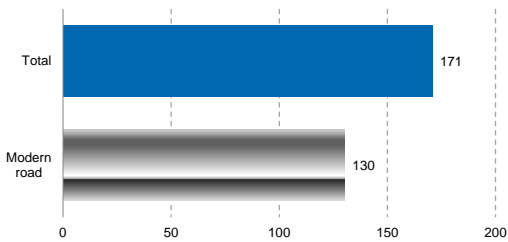

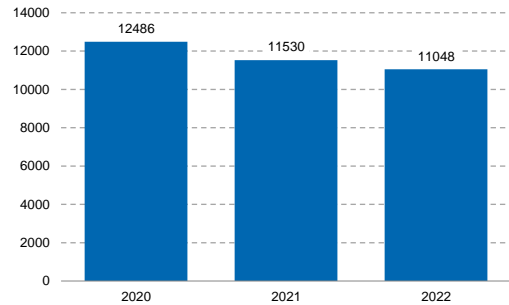

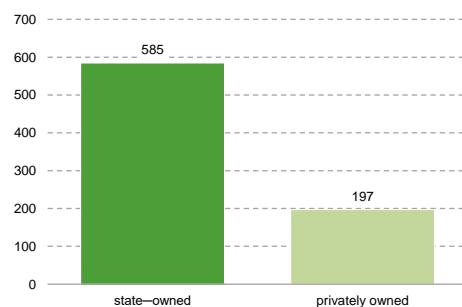

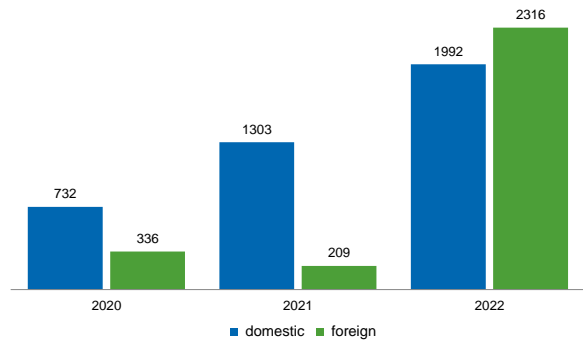

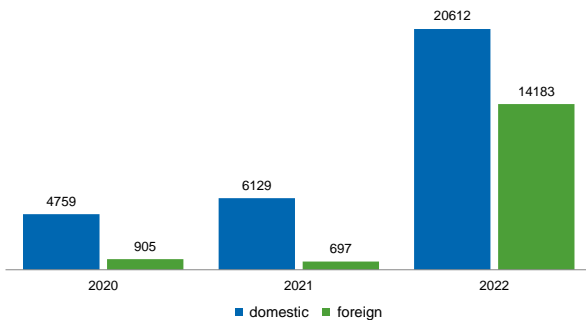

## Tourists arrivals, 2020–2022.



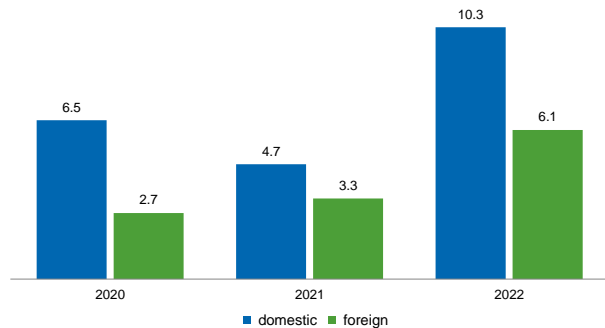
