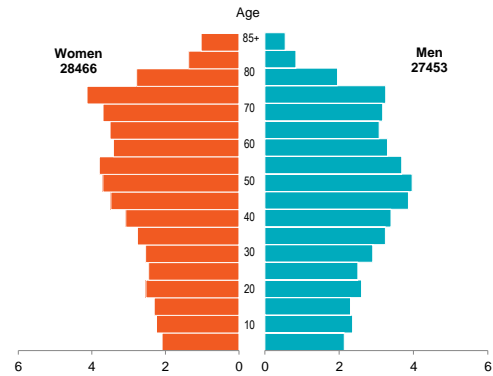

## Population by five-year age groups and sex, 2024 (%)



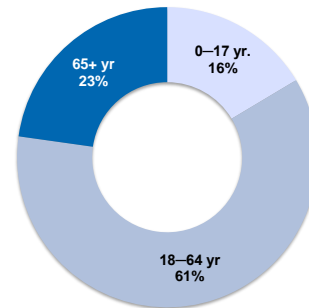

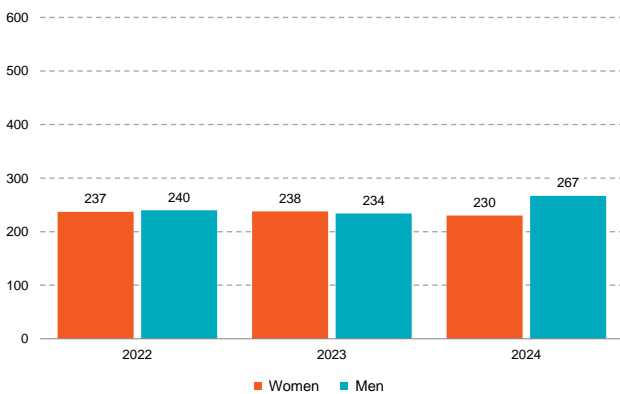

## Population by age groups, 2024



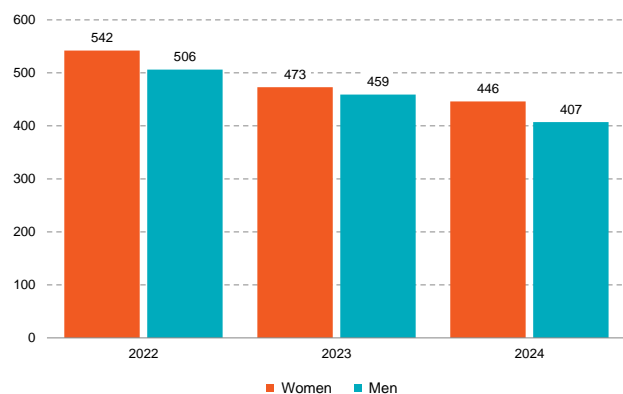

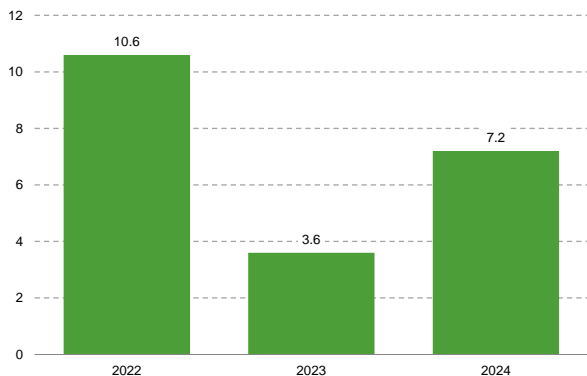
## Deaths by sex, 2022–2024

### Suicide mortality rate, 2022–2024

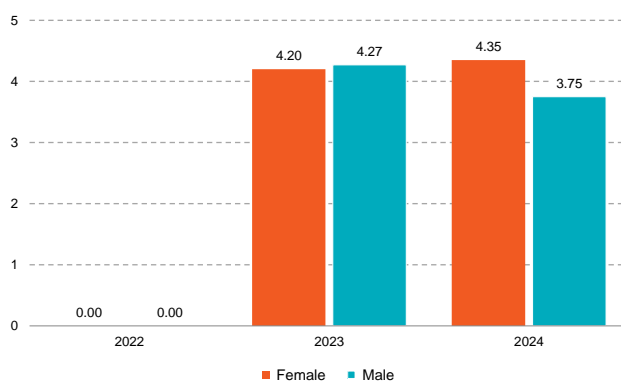

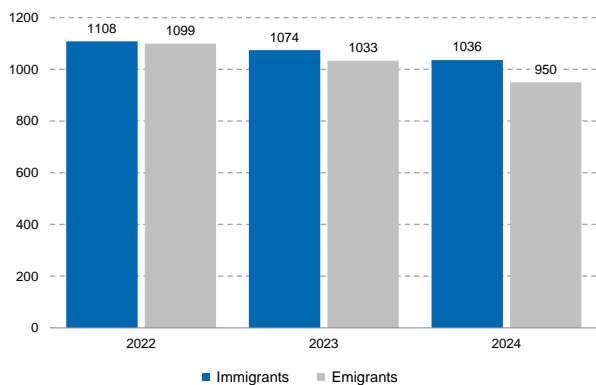

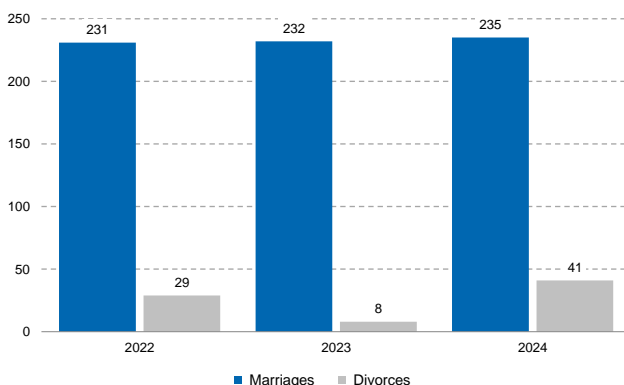

### Immigrants and emigrants, 2022–2024



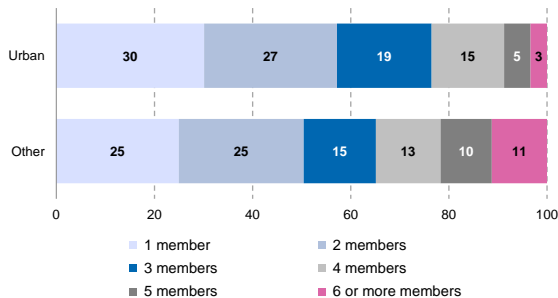

### Marriages and divorces, 2022–2024



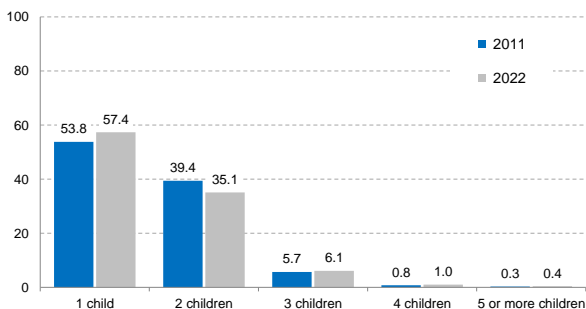

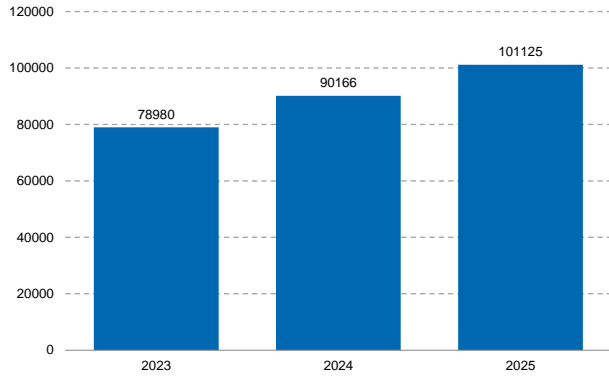

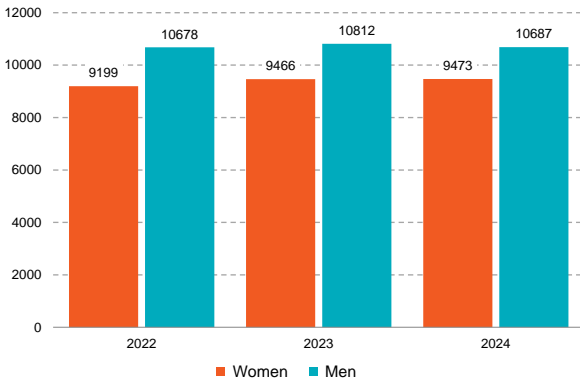
## Average annual net salaries and wages\*, 2023–2025 (RSD)

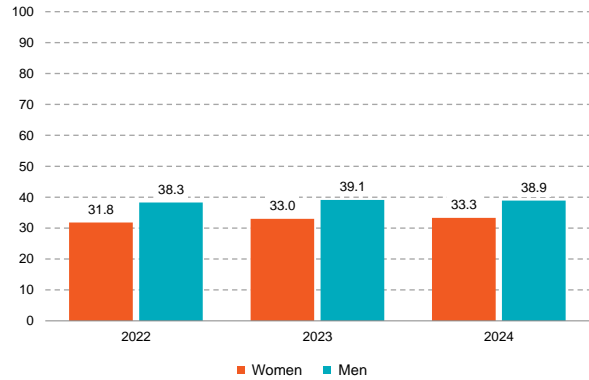

## Registered employees by municipalities of residence, 2022–2024\*



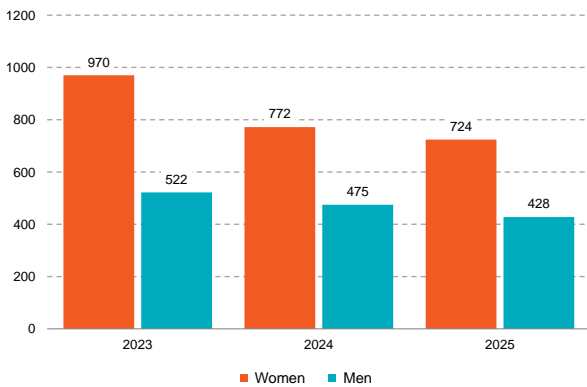

## Registered employees by municipalities of residence comparing to population number, 2022–2024 (%)



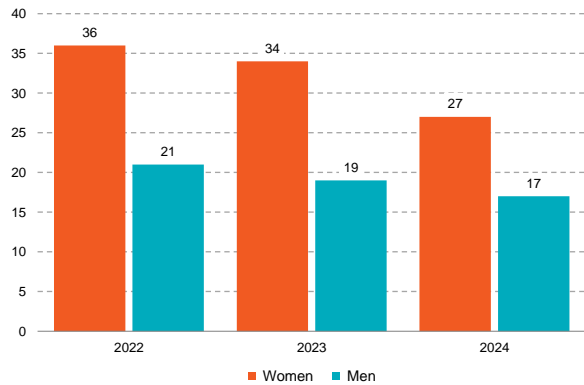

## Registered unemployed by sex, 2023–2025\*



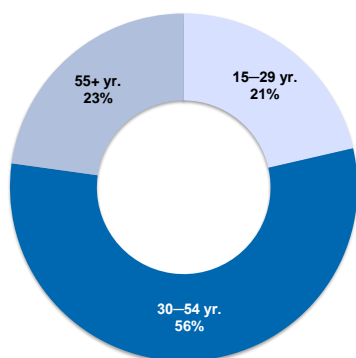

## Registered unemployed per 1,000 inhabitants, by sex 2022–2024\*



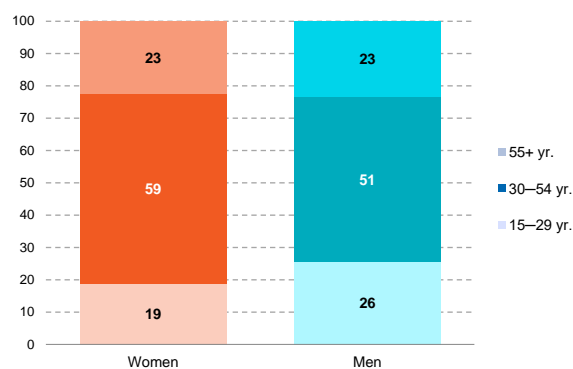

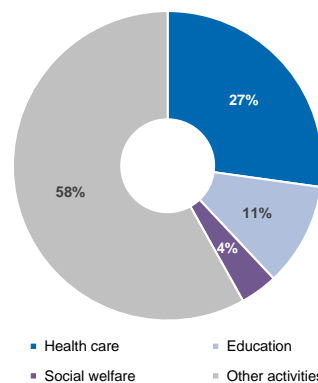

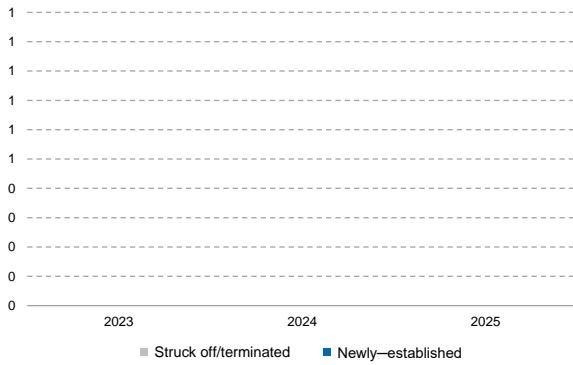

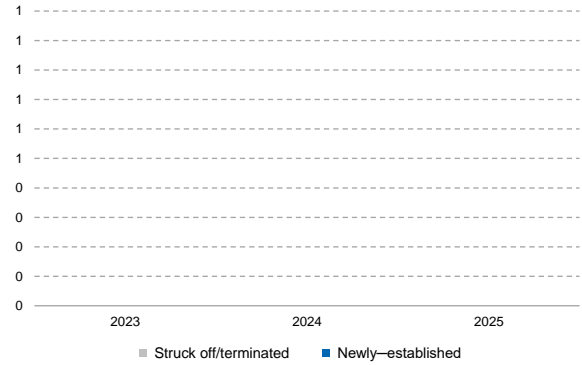

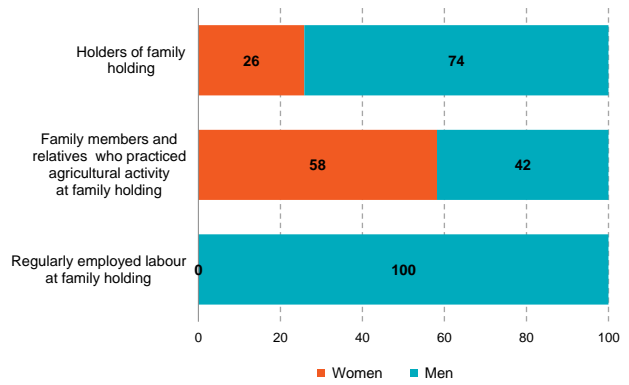

**Members and labour regularly employed at family holding by sex, 2023 (%)**


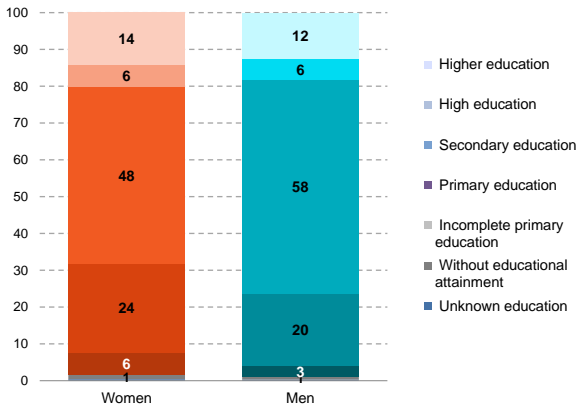

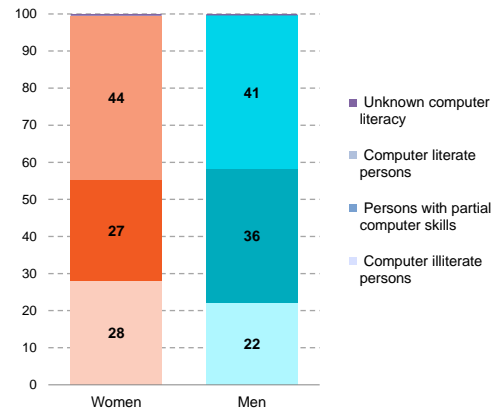

**Population aged 15 and over by educational attainment and sex, 2022 (%)**



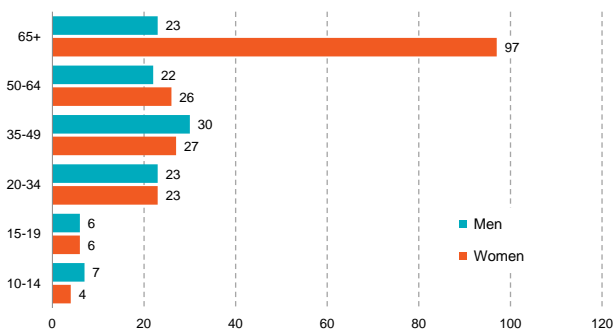

**Population aged 15 and over by computer literacy, 2022 (%)**



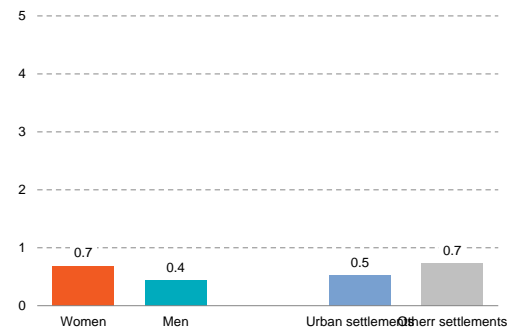

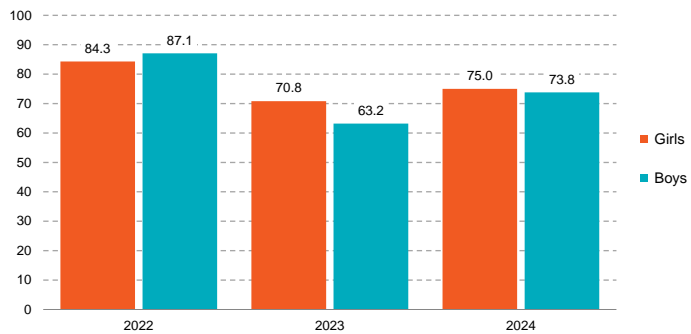

### Coverage of children by the preparatory preschool programme, 2022–2024 (%)



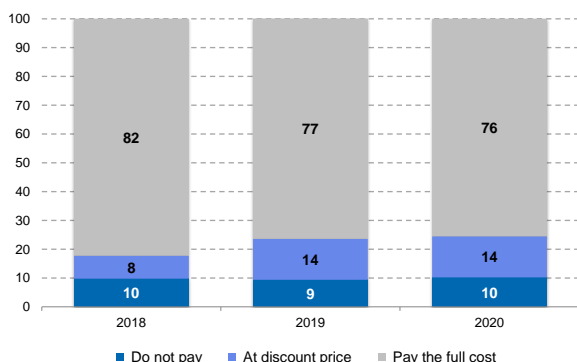

### Children attending preschool education by the share of costs payable by their parents, 2018–2020 (%)



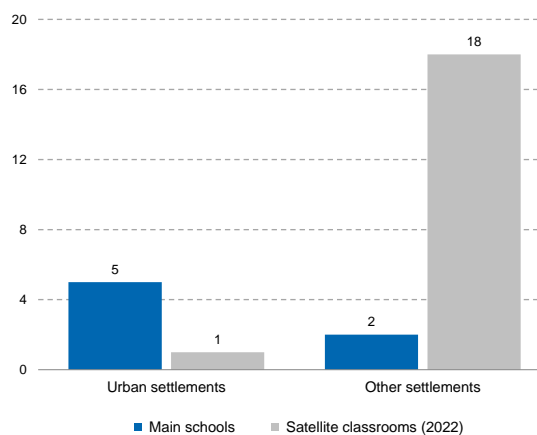

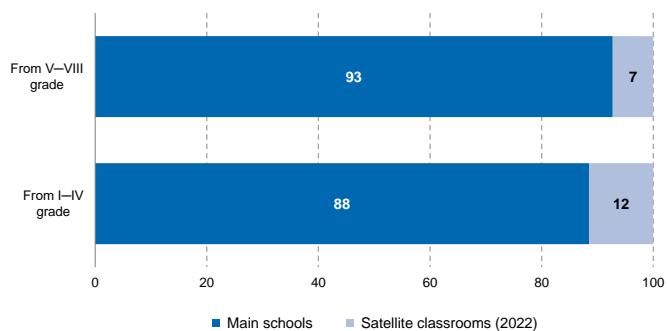

### Students enrolled in primary school, 2025 (%)



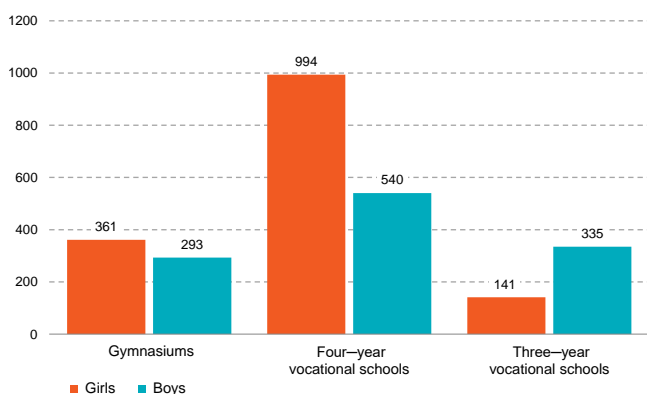

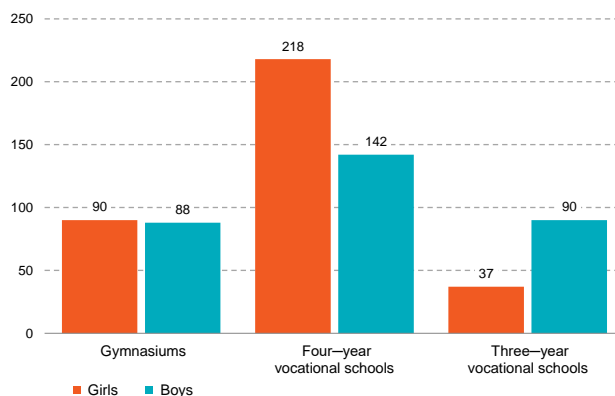

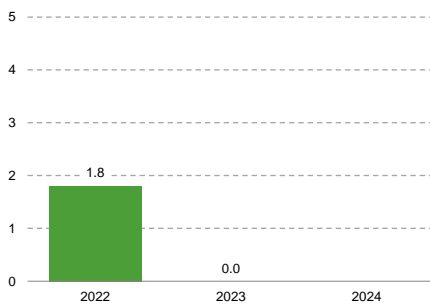

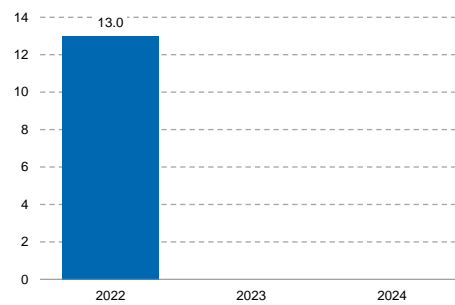

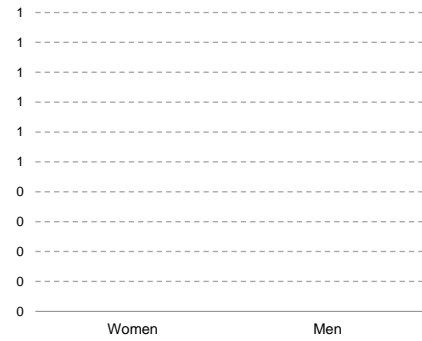

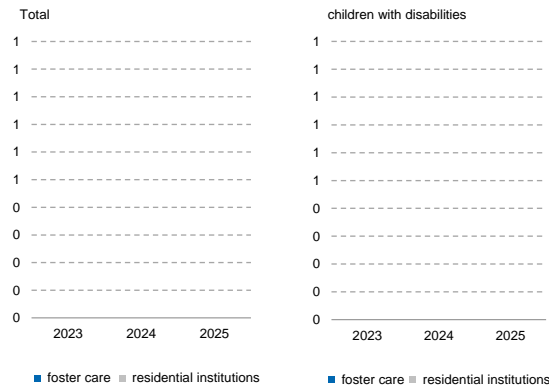

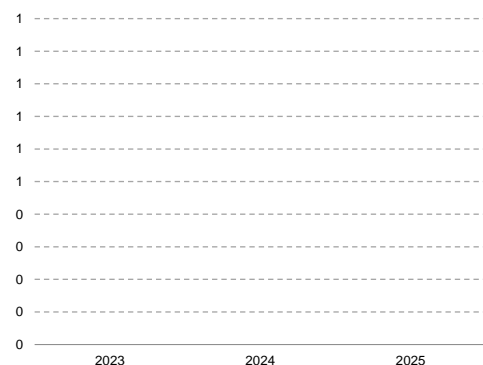

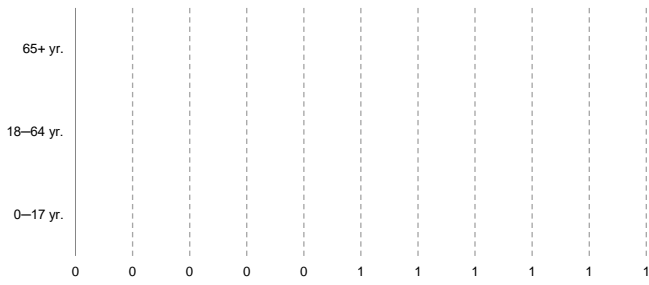

**Number of cash social assistance (income support) beneficiaries (persons), 2023–2025\***



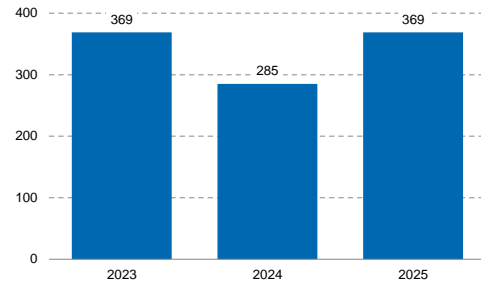

**Number of child allowance beneficiaries, 2023-2025\***



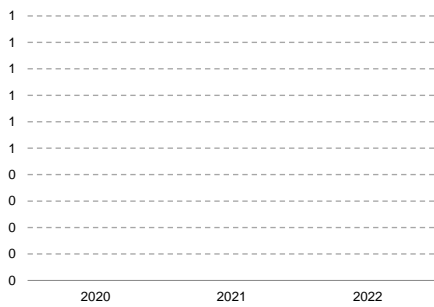

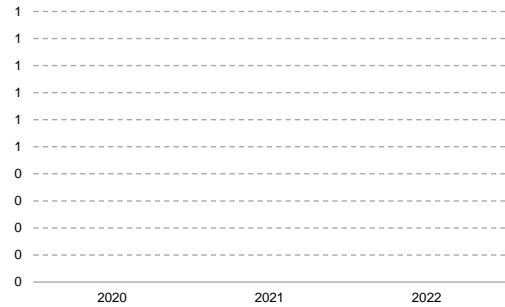

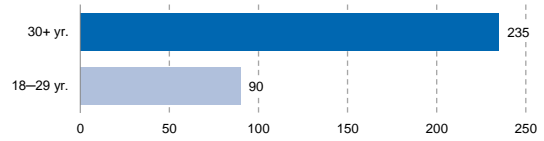

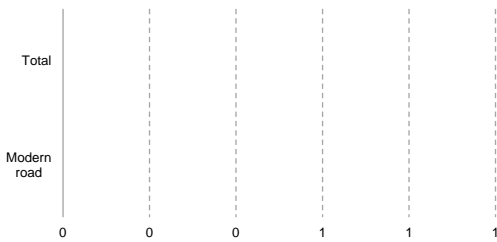

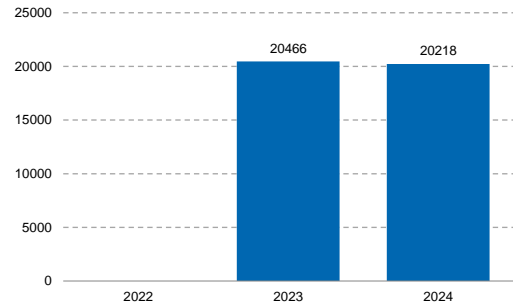

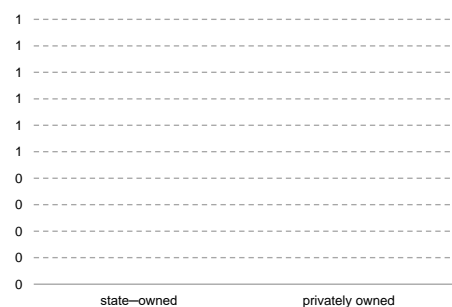

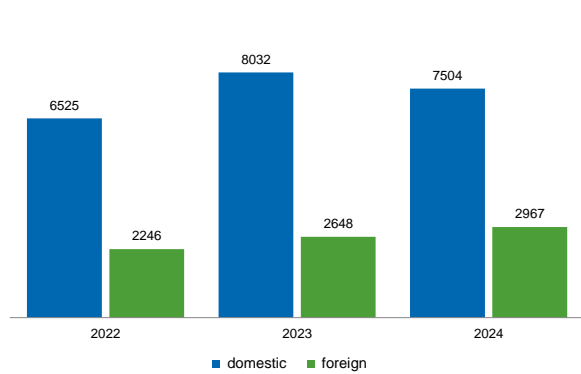

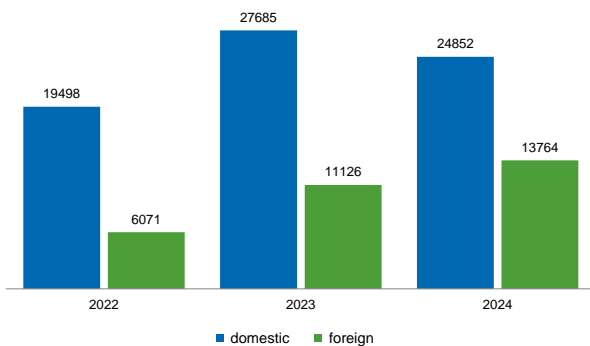

## Tourists arrivals, 2022–2024



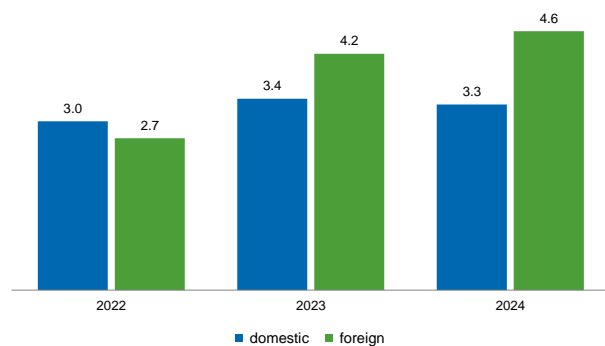
